

"Man vs. Wild"

One of the most intriguing sections of the Bible comes from Jesus' time in the wilderness. Matthew chapter four begins with these words, "Then Jesus was led by the Spirit into the wilderness to be tempted by the devil." Please know the Judean Wilderness looks nothing like what we think of when we imagine a wilderness in the United States. It is a rather desolate section of that region of the world. I do believe it has its own form of beauty. In fact, certain sections are breathtaking. However, it can be a very lonely place, and it is surely not a wilderness in the way I envisioned a wilderness from my childhood and early adult life. A better description for it would be to call it a desert. In fact, when describing that region, the term desert is used more often than wilderness by most people today.

This June we are going to journey this wilderness (or desert) with Jesus with our news series "Man vs. Wild". We will breakdown each of the temptations our Savior endured. When you break down each temptation, I believe you will find you have been tempted in similar ways throughout your life, and we can all learn from how Jesus responds to the temptations he encounters. Below is the schedule for the series:

June 11: The Temptation of the Bread (Matthew 4:1-4; Hebrews 4:15)

June 18: The Temptation at the Pinnacle (Matthew 4:5-7; Exodus 17:2-3, 7; Deuteronomy 6:16)

June 25: The Temptation of the World (Matthew 4:8-11; Matthew 16:24-26)

Ultimately, as we dive deeper into Christ's temptations, we will find we are faced with the same question – will we choose the way of the world or the way of the cross/the way of Christ? Temptation is often viewed as a taboo or uncomfortable subject, but I sure hope you will join us this June as we discover how important this topic is for our spiritual journey. I hope you will join us as we learn from Jesus himself.
