Peace will come. Your outstanding work will continue.

You have a new Senior Pastor on the way and from what I hear about him, his arrival should inspire a few verses of Joy to the World! Rev. David Beam currently serves as Senior Pastor at First UMC in Franklin, NC. His leadership there (as preacher, teacher, pastor, vision-caster, and administrator) is exemplary. When I informed a long-time leader in our Annual Conference of the new assignment to Mt. Tabor, he replied: "That is fantastic news for that church! I love David, and Mt. Tabor will quickly learn to love him, too." Yep, it sounds like a few verses of Joy to the World would be appropriate.

Of course, there is a bit of sadness (In the Bleak Midwinter) on my part as my time with you is coming to a close far too quickly. I've made a lot of jokes about using the phrase, "Hey, I'm only an Interim!" But, the truth is that I quickly felt like more than that. 
Youth Ministries at Mount Tabor UMC


