

December 1, 2024: The Beginning of Advent

Advent is the beginning of the Christian year or calendar and begins 4 Sundays before Christmas. It lasts 22 or 28 days depending on the year. The word Advent comes from *adventus* which means coming or arrival. During Advent, we prepare our hearts to celebrate the birth of Jesus, his presence within us, and his return in the future. Below are some opportunities for you to spiritually prepare for the birth of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ.

- Advent Devotionals are available in the Narthex of the Sanctuary, at the Welcome Center Desk on Sundays, and in the Church Office. This year's Advent Devotional is, "O Come, O Come, Emmanuel." In the devotional are Henri Nouwen's thoughts along with daily scripture verses, and reflections and prayers by author Steve Givens.
- **Children and Family Devotionals** will also be in the Narthex, Welcome Center, and in the Church Office.
- Wednesday Women's Bible Study continues an Advent Study, "The Weary World Rejoices" based on the study by Kate Bowler, on Dec. 4 and Dec. 11 at 9:30 am in the Fellowship Hall and also via Zoom.
- **Tabor Troupers (Seniors 60+)** will meet on Monday, Dec. 16 at 11:30 am in the Fellowship Hall. The program will be "Biltmore Christmas" by Brian Hawley, Biltmore Scholar. Please register in the Connect Corner in the Welcome Center or in your Sunday School Class.
