Welcoming Pastor David Beam to Mount Tabor





Let's Stuff the Bus!

Stuff the Bus 2024 will be Sunday, August 4, from 8:30am until 12:15pm. As usual, we will be collecting school supplies (please pay attention to the particular needs listed below), clothing items (consistent with North Hills' uniform policy – see below) and personal hygiene items for the students at North Hills Elementary School (NHES). We will also be collecting non-perishable food items for the Food for Thought.

Food for Thought is the Mount Tabor UMC food pantry for Winston-Salem Forsyth County Schools. It is located at the WSFCS social workers office. School social workers deliver food to families known to teachers and administrators as being in need. Your food donations help restock the pantry, and your monetary donations help defray the cost of purchasing other food items from the Second Harvest Food Bank.

NHES is our partner school in the Winston-Salem Forsyth County system. Mount Tabor UMC administers a Backpack Program at NHES, collects much needed school supplies each year through Stuff the Bus, and provides volunteers for various other activities at North Hills. Please remember that 25% of all families in our geographic area have difficulty providing food and school supplies for their children and that NHES serves a particularly impoverished area. So, watch for sales at your favorite stores and stock up on school supplies for North Hills and non-perishable food for Food for Thought.

With regard to school supplies, NHES especially needs clothing and shoes (consistent with uniform policy – see below), tissues, wet-wipes, hand sanitizer, composition style notebooks (not spiral), zip-lock bags (both sandwich and gallon size), colored pencils, markers (regular and dry erase), dry erase erasers, post-it notes, masking tape, pocket folders (with and without prongs), and 3x5 index cards.

Please note: NHES already has **an oversupply** of loose-leaf paper, folders, pencils, sharpies, glue, spiral notebooks, 3-ring binders, mechanical pencils and pens, scissors, paper clips, and crayons. They don't need any more of these items this year.

The North Hills Uniform Policy

Girls: Khaki or black skirts or jumpers; solid black or white tights; khaki or black slacks or shorts; Oxford blouses (solid black, white or red); broadcloth blouses (solid black, white or red); solid black or white sweaters; white or black socks; brown or black belts. Please note: Pants and shorts (sizes 6 and 7) and white shirts (sizes 10 and up) are especially needed.

Boys: Khaki or black slacks or shorts; Oxford shirts (solid black, white or red); polo shirts (solid black, white or red); knit shirts (solid black, white or red); solid black or white sweaters; white or black socks; brown or black belts. Please note: Khaki pants and shorts (sizes 5 to 16), white shirts (sizes10 and up), and smaller belts are especially needed.

Finally, if you shop at Harris Teeter, don't forget to "link" your VIC card to North Hills Elementary School, so that they receive that donation, too.


