TABOR TALK

In this newsletter (as in our weekly bulletins), you'll see lists of Advent activities upcoming for us at Mt. Tabor: worship services, dramatic presentations, mission opportunities, fellowship activities, youth and children's programming, and on and on. It looks like a busy December for our church ... but a really "good busy." I'd like to mention a couple things that will make the "good" part even better.

First, put a star on your calendar next to Sunday, December 10. Preaching for us that morning will be Dr. Preston Davis, Minister to High Point University. To put it simply (though, hopefully, not simplistically), Preston is a rock star in our Annual Conference and in the whole world of ministry to university students. He's so gifted that HPU recently made him a Vice President (so far as I know, he's the first university Chaplain in their history to receive that recognition). He's engaging, personable, and best of all the guy can preach! I mean, he can really, really preach. You're going to love him. So, as I said, put a star on your calendar for that day. (Long before I knew I would have the honor of serving as your Interim Pastor, I accepted an invitation to preach that Sunday at Highlands UMC where they are using a little Advent book I wrote as a seasonal study guide. You won't mind my being absent that day once you hear Preston. You may even ask me to accept additional invitations!)

Second, as you buy and wrap presents for family, friends, and co-workers, let me ask you to give yourself a gift. Jesus said we should love our neighbors as ourselves. So, practice a little self-care in December. It is arguably the busiest month of the year. Busy-ness requires energy. And energy requires pacing. We move forward by occasionally pulling back. Even race cars have to take pit stops to refuel. Or (and this is a far better illustration), the gospels teach that from time to time "Jesus withdrew to a quiet place." He stepped back from the demanding crowds and all the noise of His life to rest, to pray, to renew and restore Himself. I have a friend in NYC named Nunzio Gubitosa. He trains people to become psychotherapists. Nunzio said he tells them, "If you don't take adequate care of yourself, in time there won't be enough self left to take adequate care of anyone or anything else." Pay attention to that. Add rest alongside work – add leisure activities alongside responsibilities – add "can wait" alongside "must do" – add silence alongside the noise of the season – add prayer alongside service – add something fun to your days so that you can make the season bright for all the others who count on you. Remember: "If you don't take adequate care of yourself, in time there won't be enough self left to take adequate care of anyone or anything else."

December is going to be a really busy month for us at Mt. Tabor. Let's make sure it's good busy. !
